Positive Changes

Noticed changes to the parking lot? Then the sealing work is complete. An additional 5 handicap spots have been created by changing the parking spacing of 2 rows. No increase to the handicap lot size was required, and ADA requirements are still maintained. Fairfield County Chorus Is Back

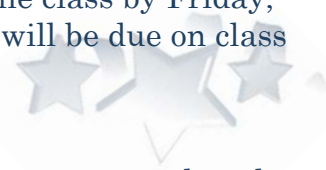

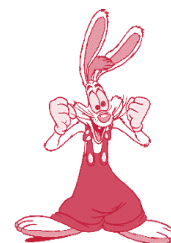


Flick Of The Month and Drama Performance!

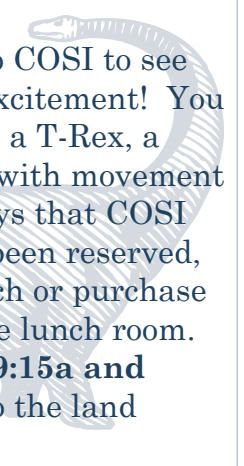
