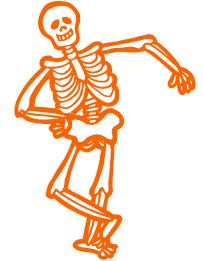





### Senior for Seniors
