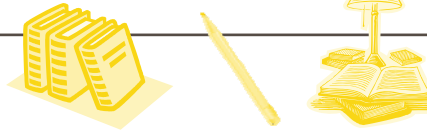

### Generations on Line

Want to learn to use the internet? Olivedale now has a centralized computer located in the library. This computer is for all members to use but specifically for those who want to learn by using Generations on Line web based software. Generations on Line® is a non-profit program that introduces the Internet to seniors where they live or congregate. Using familiar images and large type instructions, the program guides those with no computer experience through basic email, a search by Yahoo!, links to other sites and an



intergenerational chat about the past, called Memories: Generation to generation. Internet technology is making the world a smaller place, but only for those people who have the know-how and access to it. Generations on Line promotes Internet literacy, access and skill, helps overcome fears and reluctance of the new electronic media, encourages communication among generations, is fast, easy and free to use. This software licensing fee is being provided by Southeastern Ohio Center for Independent Living SOCIL through a grant.

## Classes

### Ballroom Dance Class

The instructor for Olivedale's ballroom classes is "Stan The Music Man". He began his dancing career at the young age of 4 years and has not stopped dancing yet! The dance for September is the Argentine Tango. It is a social dance and musical genre, written in 4/4 measure and with binary musical form. Its lyrics and music are marked by nostalgia, expressed through melodic instruments like the bandoneon (a type of concerto). The dance originated at the ending of the 19th century in the suburbs of Buenos Aires. It quickly grew in popularity and rapidly spread internationally. Classes are **every Friday at 1:00p, \$5 per class**, payable at the office. No partner is needed.



### **Annie Oakley And Bears Mill**

The Garst Museum houses the largest known collection of memorabilia of "Little Sure Shot" (who began shooting at 8!), includes guns, clothing, pictures, posters etc. Outside in the streets, hosted by the museum, is Dave's Diggety-Dog Festival, named after none other than Annie Oakley's dog, Dave. **Departs 8:30a, returns 7:00p. \$42, travel and admission.** A fast food stop, on your own, will be made on the way back.



### **Perry Como**

One of the most popular male vocalists of all time, Perry Como, spanned more than 6 decades of singing. His records sold more than 100 million copies, with 27 each reaching the million record mark! Songs like *Some Enchanted Evening*, *It's Impossible*, *Hot Diggity*, *And I Love You So* and *Catch a falling Star* are the products of his warm, smooth and easy listening to voice. Mr. Como had 13 #1 hit songs—the 1st was *Till The End Of Time* in 1945. Perry Como had quite a career. He began as a barber, performed on radio, made 5 movies, had television shows and traveled around performing concerts.
