Ballroom Dancing

Add romance to your February and Valentine's Day by learning to ballroom dance! The Country Waltz is the choice ballroom dance for February. The Country Waltz is mostly progressive, moving counter clock wise around the dance floor. Both the posture and frame are relaxed. The waltz became fashionable in Vienna around the 1780s, spreading to many other countries in the years to follow. It became fashionable in Britain during the Regency Period, though the entry in the Oxford English Dictionary shows that it was considered "riotous and indecent" as late as 1825. The waltz, and especially its closed position, became the example for the creation of many other ballroom dances. Ballroom dance classes are held every **Friday at 1:00p; \$5** per person per lesson, payable at the office before class. No partner required.



Clogging Classes

Clogging is a type of folk dance with roots in traditional European dancing, early African American dance, and the Cherokee traditional dance in which the dancer's footwear is used musically by striking the heel, the toe, or both in unison against the floor or each other to create audible percussive



rhythms. Clogging was a social dance in the Appalachian Mountains as early as the 18th century. A fun fact about clogging; it is the official state dance of Kentucky and North Carolina! Classes are \$2 and held every **Wednesday morning at 9:30a** except for the 3rd Wednesday.

Basket Class

Just in time for St. Valentines Day! Make that someone special a red heart basket **Monday, February 13 starting at 9:00a**. The base will be 7 x 7 and will be 3" high with 3 rows of red and a fancy braided edge. Cost will be **\$20** due on class day but you must reserve your place by Friday, February 10.



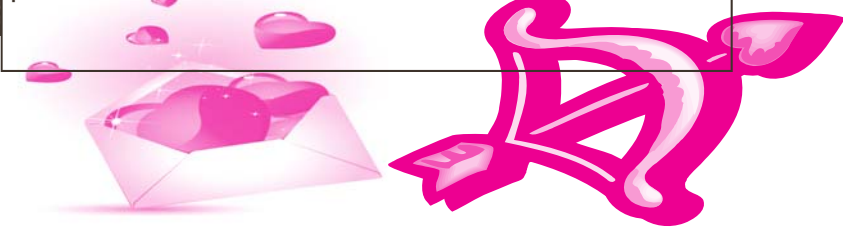

Update Your Weight Loss Plan

New research by five nutrition and public health experts at Harvard University has a few important things to say on an individual's approach to weight loss..."The study shows use of conventional wisdom; to eat everything in moderation, eat fewer calories and avoid fatty foods isn't the best approach." Rather, what you eat makes quite a difference. Counting calories won't matter much unless you consider the kind of calories you are eating. The study suggests including fresh fruits, vegetables (at least five servings each day), lean protein (non-red meats, fish, dairy especially yogurt), nuts and peanut butter, unrefined grains and unprocessed foods. Metabolism takes a hit from

refined carbohydrates, sugars and starches stripped of fiber, like white flour. Metabolism slows with consumption of refined grains but stays the same after eating whole grains. Both physical activity and diet are important to weight control, but if you remain inactive and ignore your diet, you can still gain weight. This becomes important during our cold winter months when physical activity levels tend to taper off. That's the time to consider adding an indoor physical activity program to your daily schedule.
